Notes for JOHN STREATER:

Buried at the General Baptist Meeting House (The Free Christian Church [Unitarian]) at Billingshurst, Sussex

The Meeting House was built in 1754. Burials began at about the same time. The people, as an organised community, had been in existence for some hundred years at that time. They had been meeting for worship in small groups in farm houses or barns converted for use as meeting places since they emerged from obscurity during the civil war. The earliest of the purpose built meeting houses in West Sussex was that at Horsham, erected in 1721. It served as a central meeting place for the existing groups of people scattered over a wide area, including Billingshurst, though, due to the difficulties of travel, they continued to meet separately for many years after that date. Even after the meeting house was built at Billingshurst, the people there continued to regard themselves as a part of the Horsham Church.

As the 18th century closed there began a gradual movement within the General Baptist community towards the Unitarian standpoint in religious matters and, a few years later, a gradual abandonment of the practice of believers baptism. The story of this development can be found elsewhere. It is mentioned here only to explain the change in the name of the Church from General Baptist to Free Christian or Unitarian and the building from Meeting House to Chapel. The erection of the Meeting House at Horsham stimulated the creation of a Register of Births for the use of the General Baptist community as a whole and in which the births of many of the Billingshurst people were entered. This Register had become necessary due to the reluctance of some clergy to enter births in Parish Registers where the parents declined to submit their children to the traditional rite of infant baptism. The Horsham Births Register continued to be used till the creation of the General Register in 1837.

I Rhoda Parsons Nye Fuller of Worthing in the County of Sussex Widow and relict of Felix Fuller late of Worthing aforesaid declare as follows. This is to say – That I am sixty nine years of age and upwards and that I was born at Billingshurst in the said County and that I was the Daughter of Sarah Nye the widow and Relict of William Nye formerly of Priors Farm in the Parish of Billingshurst aforesaid and that my Mother the said Sarah Nye died at Billingshurst aforesaid on the twenty first day of November One thousand eight hundred and five leaving my sister Anne the Wife of John Streater her surviving – That the said Anne Streater had one Son and one Daughter only named William Nye Streater at present residing at Billingshurst aforesaid Yeoman and Mary Ann afterwards the wife of Thomas Trower of Billingshurst aforesaid Yeoman - That my Mother the said Sarah Nye was as long as I can remember in the uninterrupted enjoyment of the Lands and Premises known as Priors Farm in Billingshurst aforesaid up to her death at which period my sister the said Anne Streater came into the enjoyment of the same Estate and so continued until her death which happened on the twenty sixth day of December One thousand eight hundred and forty five since which time her Husband and her only Son the said William Nye Streater have been successively in the uninterrupted possession of the rents and profits of the same Estate – That the said John Streater the Father died on the twenty second day of April One thousand eight hundred and forty seven and was buried at the Baptist Burial ground in Billingshurst aforesaid. And I make this solemn Declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true and by virtue of the provisions of an Act made and passed in the session of Parliament of the fifth and sixth years of the reign of His late majesty King William the fourth entitled “An Act to repeak and Act of the present session of Parliament “ intitled “An Act for the more effectual abolition of Oaths and Affirmations taken and made in various Departments of the State and to substitute Declarations in lieu thereof and for the more entire suppression of voluntary and extra judicial Oaths and Affidavits and to make other provisions for the abolition of unnecessary Oaths.”

Declared at Worthing in the County of Sussex this 5th day of November 1861. Rhoda Parsons Nye Fuller

This is the last will and testament of me Felix Fuller of Worthing in the county of Sussex coachbuilder I give and bequeath all my monies securities for money money in the funds goods chattels and personal estate and effects of whatever nature and kind soever or whatsoever the same may be unto my sons in law George Henry French of Worthing aforesaid printer and Charles Pannell of Petworth in the said county Farmer my son William Fuller and Edward Jenner of Shoreham in the said county Grocer their executors administrators and assigns upon trust that they my said trustees or the survivors or survivor of them or the executors or administrators of such survivor do and shall with all convenient speed after my decease collect get in and receive all such money as shall be then due and owing to me from any person or persons whomsoever and do and shall sell dispose of and convert into money all such part of my personal estate as shall not consist of money or money in the funds (except the furniture and other household effects in my dwellinghouse at the time of my decease which it is my will shall not be sold during the life or widowhood of my wife Rhoda Fuller and I do and shall by out of that part of my personal estate which shall consist of money and the money to be collected and received as aforesaid belonging to me at my death (which my said trustees or trustee are and is hereby authorised and empowered at any time to sell and dispose of pay and discharge all my just debts and funeral and testamentary expenses and do and shall lay out and invest the residue of the said trust monies in or upon some or one of the Government stocks or public funds of Great Britain or upon real securities in England and do and shall from time to time alter vary and change the securities in or upon which the said trust monies shall be invested either as occasion shall require or as he or their or his discretion shall think fit and do and shall stand and be possessed of the said trust monies stocks funds and securities and the dividends interest and income thereof upon trust that they my said trustees or trustee do and shall from time to time during the life of my said wife if after my death she shall not marry any other person pay and apply the dividends interest and income of the said trust monies stocks funds and securities unto or permit the same to be received of my said wife for her support and benefit and ????? and after the decease of my said wife or which shall first happen her marriage with any other person do and shall stand and be possessed of those said trust monies stocks funds and securities and the dividend interest and income thereof upon trust to pay and divide one tenth part thereof unto and equally between Thomas Fuller and Frederick Fuller natural children of my late son Thomas Fuller and Felix Fuller, Edward Fuller and Emma Fuller three other children

of my said son Thomas Fuller deceased but in case either of them the said Thomas Fuller Frederick Fuller Felix Fuller Edward Fuller and Emma Fuller shall die in the lifetime of the others or other of them under the age of twenty one years without issue then the share of him her or them so dying shall go to the survivors or survivor of them in equal shares and proportions one other tenth part thereof unto my niece Ann Fuller Daughter of my late brother James Fuller one other tenth part thereof unto and equally between Marten Stubbs Fuller and Emma Jane Fuller children of my late son Frederick Fuller and in case either of them the said Marten Stubbs Fuller and Emma Jane Fuller shall die in the lifetime of the other of them under the age of twenty one and without issue then the share of him or her so dying shall go to the survivor one other tenth part thereof unto my son Robert Fuller one other tenth part thereof unto Edward Mitchell son of my late daughter Eliza Mitchell but in case the said Edward Mitchell shall die under the age of twenty one years without issue then I direct that his share in the said trust monies shall sink into and form part of my personal estate one other tenth part unto my son William Fuller one other tenth part thereof unto my daughter Jane the wife of the said Charles Pannell one other tenth part thereof unto my daughter Mary Ann the wife of William Miller one other tenth part thereof unto my son Marten Fuller and the remaining tenth part unto my daughter Clara the wife of the said George Henry French and my will is and I do hereby declare that in case any or either of my said children or my said niece Ann Fuller shall happen to die in my lifetime and shall have no lawful issue then the share or shares of him or her or them dying of and in the said trust monies shall sink into and form part of my personal estate But in case any or either of my said children or my said niece Ann Fuller shall happen to die in my lifetime and shall leave lawful issue then the respective issue of each of them so dying and leaving lawful issue shall have and be entitled to such part or share or parts or shares both original and accruing of and in the said trust monies as the parent thereof respectively would have had and been entitled to in case he or she or they had not died And it is my further will and I hereby direct that subject to the trusts hereinbefore declared it shall and may be lawful to and for my said trustees trusts for the time being of this my will to apply all or any part of the interest dividends and income of the share of each of the said Thomas Fuller and Frederick Fuller or such of my grandchildren who may become entitled to participate in the aforesaid trusts or of the issue of the said Thomas Fuller and Frederick Fuller or any deceased grandchild of and in the said trust monies stocks funds and securities in or towards his or her maintenance and education during his or her minority and I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said sons in law George Henry French and Charles Pannell and my said son William Fuller and the said Edward Jenner executors of this my will and I hereby declare and direct that my said executors and trustees and each and every of them their and each and every of their heirs executors administrators and assigns shall be chargeable respectively only for such monies as they shall respectively and actually receive by virtue of this my will notwithstanding this or either of their giving or joining or signing any receipt or receipts for the sake of conformity and that any or one of them shall not be answerable for the others or other of them or for the acts receipts neglects or defaults of the others or other of them but each and every of them only for his own acts receipts neglects or defaults respectively and that the one of them shall not be answerable for any bankers brokers or other person with whom or in whose hands any part of the said monies may be deposited or lodged for safe custody or otherwise in the execution of the trusts aforesaid nor for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security or securities stocks or funds in or upon which the said trust monies or any part thereof shall be placed or invested nor for any involuntary loss or damage that may happen in the execution of the aforesaid trusts or in relation thereto (except the same shall happen by or through their or his own wilful neglect or default respectively) and also that it shall and may be lawful for the said trustees hereinbefore named and each of them their and each and every of their executors administrators and assigns by and out of the monies which shall come to their respective hands by virtue of the trusts aforesaid to return to and reimburse themselves and himself respectively and also to allow the co trustees and co trustee all costs charges damages and expenses which they or any or either of them may sustain expend or be put unto in or about the execution of the aforesaid trusts or in relation thereto and I give and devise all estates vested in me to the said George Henry French, Charles Pannell, William Fuller and Edward Norma Margaret ouisa Harris was born 12 January 1930 at the Alexander Nursing Home, Wellington to Frederick Harris and Margaret Valentine. Her mother was the daughter of Jewish tailors from the east end of London and her father was in the merchant navy, the son of a London fishmonger and an Italian opera singer. Norma grew up in Mitcheltown, Te Aro, Wellington and lived in an home next to the old schoolhouse at the very end of the now famous street Holloway Rd.

Norma was a sickly child had skinny legs but, even then, had an artistic flair. Because of her poor health, she left school early to become a dancer in the hope that the physical exercise of dance would contribute to better health. She trained in ballet and dance with the Dorothy Daniels Dance Studio in Wellington and progressed with distinction through the grades until she qualified in grade 8 performance, the pinnacle of dancing achievement. Norma appeared in numerous stage productions for a number of years. She travelled extensively throughout NZ.

She won awards for her performance and very soon after she left school (at an early age) and began "treading the boards". She toured extensively and performed in countless productions in a stage career that spanned almost 20 years. Norma had a particular and somewhat cheeky character that could conjure fantasy and she put this into her performance and it became a mainstay of her character throughout life.

In her early twenties she met Edwin (Eddie) Lister Handricks. They met on stage during a performance of "The Boyfriend" – got engaged during a performance of "The Girlfriend" and were married, without a hint of irony, during the performance run of "The Merry Widow". Eddie located and purchased their first home, 9 Farringdon St, Glen Innes, and not too soon after their first child and son, Ian Lister handricks was born in the front room of the new house. Their second child and daughter Lynette followed a couple of years later and eventually after a number of miscarriages and battles with anemia, a third child, Glenn, was born

Norma always took great care of her appearance, and was considered by most to be up with the latest fashions – how we came to live in an olive green house, with lime green lounge suite, alternating pastel pink and blue kitchen cupboard doors and khaki floor tiles – obviously had nothing to do with Mum's colour sense! The family grew and all three children married and produced in all eight grandchildren. She doted on them all and they were always guaranteed of her exquisitely wrapped gifts at birthdays and xmas. The first grandchild and only grandson was Daniel Logan Handricks, Ian's son.

Norma's second great career was dressmaking and in particular, costume, fairy and fantasy outfits. She had a special talent here and her children were guinea pigs for her early endeavours. Every year they were decked out in costumes for xmas functions and parties as either scullery maids, cooks, quasimodo, witches – you name it she could create it! Norma started her own business, "Wandering Star", making and supplying the fairy shop with all manner of costumes, wings, wands and paraphenalia.

The urge to dance never left Norma. She began again later in life performing ballet in recital and retained her poise and fascination with this art to the end. Through dance and an enduring friendship of more than 50 years ago, she met Pauline Chamberlain. Pauline also shared the passion of dance - and even tried, it may noted - without success - to teach Norma's son, Ian, how to ballroom dance. In her later years Norma continued to sew and craft her fabulous creations – and enjoyed nothing more than a cup of tea and chocolate maccaroon. She had a ethreal spirit, enjoyed doing cryptic crosswords, taught her children to have a sense of fun and to approach situations with a lighthearted and humorous demeanor.

Norma's marriage to Eddie was not a happy one. Eddie was a difficult man who had a temper, was short-fused and was somewhat disengaged with the family. Although they were married for almost 60 years, Norma asked Eddie to leave after 53 years of them being together. It was an acrimonious split and they really never engaged in dialogue much after that time. Norma moved into an apartment and fared for herself (with Ian and Lynette's support) to the end.

In July 2011 Norma was advised that she was suffering from terminal Leukemia and that she would only have a limited time left. She passed away at St Andrew's Hospital, Glendowie, Auckland on 11 Dec 2011 in her 82nd year. Her funeral was held at St Paul's Church, St Heliers and she was laid to rest at Purewa Cemetery, in Meadowbank, Auckland.

Edwin was born in Gisborne and got his middle name, "Lister" from the name of the hospital (a former brothel) in Gisborne where he was born. Ruby, his mother, was suffering from peritonitis at the time of his birth and in thanks for the staff at the hospital managing to save both mother and child, Ruby name him "Lister". Ian, Eddie's son, also was named Lister.

Edwin attended Seddon Memorial Technical College and later completed an apprenticeship as an electrician. He served during World War II in the Air Force as a ground technician and has had a life long interest in the theatre, especially as electrical back-stage crew with His Majesty's Theatre in Auckland and a number of other theatres throughout NZ. He started his electrical career with ECC (Electrical Construction Co.) and later went onto join the Auckland Electric Power Board becoming Chief Inspector for a number of years. After Norma and he married they moved to thier first home at 9 Farringdon St, Glen Innes where the three children were raised. They then moved to 9 Dale Cres, Pakuranga

and onto Prince Regent Dr, Howick. They then moved to Papamoa. Eddie was an active member of the Institute of Electricians (and for a time President of the Institute) and had a pivotal role in the writing of the electrical wiring regulations. In his retirement he was a Taxi driver.

Eddie was a heavy smoker all his life and this affected his health. In later years he suffered from poor circulation and was admitted to hospital to undergo a triple A bypass operation, arterialgram and other procedures. Unfortunately he had his right leg amputated and in his last weeks the other leg was considered for amputation - however on the 1st May 2011 he passed away before this operation happened.

Eddie was a difficult man to live with. He had a temper and could be gruff and moody. He found it difficult to engage with his children and grandchildren. 3 years before he passed away, he and Norma split and went their separate ways. Eddie moved from boarding house to B&B and finally settled in a Presbyterian Home for the elderly. The two of them never really had much dialogue after the split. It was a difficult and often unhappy marriage.

In his earlier years, Eddie had an excellent head for mathematics and would hold an argument firmly. In later years he was forgetful, cranky, argumentative and sarcastic. He slept in late most weekends and was known to doze off frequently during stage performances at the theatre. Never successful with vehicles, virtually every car he owned broke down, cost a fortune to keep on the road or were grossly underpowered for the tasks required of them - he pulled a 10' 6" caravan, the five members of the family and the luggage around New Zealand with a side-valve 1952 10 HP Hillman Minx car!

He was certainly a character and possessed a somewhat skewed sense of humour. He was never really happy with his life and unfortunately left a legacy of unhappiness with his family.

Ian was born at home, 9 Farringdon St., Glen Innes, Auckland on the 6th July 1955. He attended Glen Innes Primary and Intermediate Schools and then onto Selwyn College where he completed 5 years of study towards entry to Auckland University. He began study towards a Bachelor of Engineering Degree. He taught music both privately and nightschool classes at Edgewater College, was for many years, a Flyman and Stage Hand at His Majesty's Theatre, apprentice baker at Klisser's Farmhouse Bakery but in 1973 he joined Hirst Contact Lens as a contact lens technician. He has been with that company ever since.

In 1977 Ian met Jocelyn and they were engaged very soon after. The marriage was planned for New Years' Eve, but had to be postponed because Ian contracted Encephalitis on Christmas Eve. The wedding took place in Feb 1978 in Dargaville Anglican Church and was well supported by the extended family.

Ian began 40 years ago as a contact lens technician after a period of study towards an engineering degree majoring in mathematics and physics. He concentrated on lens design, mathematics of lens design, developing production and marketing methods for the laboratory and eventually computerisation of the design and production of contact lenses.

Ian completed a number of advanced management, sales and marketing courses in New Zealand and the United Kingdom.

In 1979 he moved to the United Kingdom to establish and develop a large research, development and production company that introduced leading edge CNC (Computer Numerically Controlled) machining equipment for contact lens manufacture. He headed both the Computer Development Team and the International Sales and Marketing force. During this period Ian traveled extensively selling, establishing new businesses and developing and servicing computer-based technology. A number of his inventions for the optical industry were awarded patents, many of his lens constructions are now industry standard designs.

While in the UK, Ian developed Practice Management software for Optometry and designed, built and established a number of pioneering lens production laboratories throughout Europe, USA and Asia.

In 1989 Ian returned to New Zealand on an invitation to rejoin the Hirstlens group and immediately prepared a business plan for the future of the company. In 1990 he purchased the company expanded it rapidly and began the development of Beyond Imagination, a high technology unit for advancing photo-digital imaging as a business concept. During this period, Ian masterminded a substantial improvement in the marketing and promotion of contact lenses via innovative exhibitions.

In 1993 Ian designed and patented a highly successful bifocal contact lens and was a key member of the engineering team that built the tooling and multi-axis lathing systems to produce the lens. This development attracted international press and television coverage.

The bifocal design and subsequent engineering design was awarded a Foundation for Research, Science and Technology grant.

On 18th March 2012 Ian was awarded an Honorary Membership of the Cornea and Contact lens Society in recognition of outstanding contribution to contact lens practice in New Zealand. It was given for his contribution in original lens design, patents, manufacturing inventions, substantial contributions to the mathematics of optical design, clinical contributions in lens design for astigmatism, keratoconus, post-natal aphakia, bifocal and multifocal contact lenses, production methodology, the development of groundbreaking CNC manufacturing optics, surface engineering, materials research, robotics, practice management software and for the introduction of computers into the whole New Zealand optometry market.

In 1994 he began work on innovative software and business model for a photographic restoration system called Photopages (later PhotoWonder). He has managed the engineering, development, sales and marketing teams of this project since its inception. During 1999 Ian developed the franchise in the United Kingdom and completed the franchise package including authoring the manuals and support marketing material.

The growth of the photo restoration business was rapid and in 2002 a landmark sales and distribution agreement was signed with Creekside LLC in USA. Ian established large computer studios in New Zealand, China and India using his software and techniques to service the growing market developing in the USA. Walgreens, Walmart, CVS, Albertsons, Best Buy and many other major chains now use this photo restoration service exclusively. Further distribution agreements were completed for Japan, Asia and Europe and PhotoWonder is now the world's largest photo restoration company.

In 2003, Ian began work on Tooth-pix, a professional imaging service providing a comprehensive yet simple method for dental photos to be altered to show predictive outcomes for cosmetic surgery. Ian pioneered the manipulation software and techniques for Tooth-pix and has worked closely with key dentists in NZ to develop a professional on-line interface for all dentistry.

2004 saw the release of Ian's unique real estate system, Realty-Pix. Similar to Tooth-pix, it provides the opportunity for property buyers to explore the potential of a property prior to investment, encouragement for vendors to better prepare the property for sale and can inexpensively explore make-over options when considering planned home improvements. Ian has worked closely with key people within the real estate industry to advance the use of more effective marketing techniques.

Ian also is actively involved with and collaborates in developing complete business solutions, designing and building comprehensive internet and engineering complex software solutions for a wide range of commercial disciplines. These have included web-sites for publishing houses, software for asset management systems, high profile sites for automotive dealerships and real estate listing sites. In 2009 he developed a complete business plan and infrastructure to support real estate sales by lawyers.

Ian is now a director of Alexander & Co., a leading surveying company in New Zealand specializing in building enclosures and providing market leading solutions, advice and assistance in all aspects of building surveying, dispute resolution, cladding design, architecture, maintenance planning and building restoration. He is also a consultant with company providing management services.
